Let your Light Shine



Once there was a great biblical scholar who was also noted for his great piety. He spent hours every day secluded in his room studying the Scriptures, praying and meditating. One day a holy man visited the town in which the scholar lived. On hearing about it, the scholar set out to look for him.

He looked first in the Church, but did not find him there. Then he looked in a local shrine, but he wasn't there either. He looked in other likely places but failed to find him. Eventually he found him in the marketplace.

On meeting him, he told him who he was and how he spent hours every day studying the Scriptures and in prayer and meditation. Then he said, 'I have come to seek your advice on how I might grow in the service of God.'

The advice he got was simple and direct. The holy man said, 'It's easy to be a saint in your room. You should go out into the marketplace and try to be a saint there.' We are not told whether or not the scholar had the courage to act on that advice.

It is the kind of advice Jesus gives us in today's Gospel when he says, 'You are the light of the world. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on a lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of people, so that seeing your good works, they may give praise to your Father in Heaven.'

It is easy to let the light shine in the comfort and safety of one's room, but that can be a selfish thing because it means we are keeping the light to ourselves. It is not easy to let the light shine in the rough and tumble of the marketplace, but that is where it is most needed.

Lord, help us to believe in our own goodness, And to let our light of goodness shine.

This month I thought we would visit the 60's with a little lava fun.

MAKE YOUR OWN LAVA LAMP (please make sure this is supervised by an adult)





You will Need:

Glasses or Jars

Food Colouring

Cooking Oil

Water

Antacid tablets or powder

What to Do:

Fill your glass with two thirds oil and one third water.

Observe what happens to the oil and water in your glass as you add them.

Add drops of food colouring to your oil and water and watch what happens.

Place the antacid in the glass and the lava lamp effect will begin!

Why not shine a torch underneath to get the true colour show?

How does it work?

The water and oil do not mix because they have different densities. The same is the case for the food colouring.

A chemical reaction happens between the water and antacid that causes it to fizz and create carbon dioxide bubbles.


